

EXEMPTIONS FROM REQUIRED INSTRUCTION

If the religious belief and teachings of a student or his parents or his legal guardian are contrary to the content of a school subject, or to any part of a school activity, the student may be exempt from participation. To receive such an exemption the parent or legal guardian must present a written request for exemption to the school principal, stating the conflict involved.

If a student is unable to participate in a physical education class, he must present to the school principal a statement from a physician stating the reason for his inability to participate.

In both types of exemptions, alternative assignments will be provided by the classroom teacher. These assignments may be planned with the parents involved.

In the case of religious exemption whereby classroom materials and/or concepts are omitted from the alternative assignment due to parental request, the school system does not assume any further responsibilities in the area(s) of exemption(s).
